### WHO SPREADS OUT THE EARTH UPON THE WATERS

Thank You, Hashem, for keeping all of the water in its place, and leaving dry land for us to walk on.

(Remember the Tsunami and Superstorm Sandy – appreciate that these do not happen more often!)

#### WHO DID NOT MAKE ME A GENTILE

Thank You, Hashem, for making me a Jew, because Jews have many more mitzvos than gentiles have. Through my performance of mitzvos **today**, I can play a great role in kiddush Hashem and bringing the world to fulfill its ultimate purpose.

I also appreciate the special qualities, middos, and spiritual potential passed down to me from my ancestors - Avraham, Yitzchok, and Yaakov.

#### WHO GIVES SIGHT TO THE BLIND

Thank You, Hashem, for enabling me to open my eyes when I woke up this morning. Thank You for my eyelids and the muscles that enable me to open and close my eyes whenever I want!

Thank You, Hashem for creating glasses and contact lenses, and for giving me an eye doctor and the money to purchase these with the proper prescription.

#### WHO STRAIGHTENS THE BENT

Thank you, Hashem, for enabling me to stand up straight!

This brachah speceifically refers to our ability to stand up when we get out of bed.

# WHO GAVE MY MIND THE INTELLIGENCE TO DISTINGUISH BETWEEN DAY AND NIGHT

Thank You, Hashem, for giving my mind the intelligence to distinguish between day and night.

HaRav Shmuel Rozovsky zt"l adds that just as the rooster (called "sechvi" in Hebrew) is excited when it begins to sense daybreak, so too, we should be excited with the opportunities of the coming day.

#### WHO MADE ME ACCORDING TO HIS WILL

Although women have less mitzvah obligations than men have, I accept Your decision to create me this way.

On a deeper level, some say that this brachah thanks Hashem for creating women on a higher spiritual level than men - women are more naturally attuned to spirituality than men are.

#### WHO RELEASES THE BOUND

Thank You, Hashem, for enabling me to get out of bed this morning and move my muscles. Without being able to move, I would not be able to accomplish my goals for the day!

This brachah specifically refers to our ability to sit up in bed and stretch our muscles.

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#### WHO GIRDS ISRAEL WITH STRENGTH

Thank you, Hashem, for empowering me with the strength to overcome my vetzer hara, and the self-control to turn away from temptations.

This self-control is symbolized by the belt (called "aizor" in Hebrew), which separates the upper and lower halves of the body (which represent spiritual and physical desires, respectively).

#### WHO REMOVES SLEEP FROM MY EYES AND SLUMBER FROM **MY EYELIDS**

Thank You, Hashem, for removing all traces of sleepiness from me.

This brachah specifically refers to the refreshing feeling we have after washing our face each morning.

#### **WHO PREPARES MAN'S FOOTSTEPS**

Thank you, Hashem, for creating my feet with intricate bones, muscles, and nerves which enable me to walk to go everywhere I need to go.

Thank You also for assisting me in acheiving whatever I set out to do, and for quiding me toward the path which I am meant to take.

## WHO PROVIDES FOR ALL MY NEEDS

Thank you, Hashem, for giving me everything that I need, including: shoes, food, a home, air, and so much more!

In this brachah, we express appreciation for the past gifts, as well as trust that Hashem will continue to provide for us in the future.

Hashem gives us all the tools and strength that we need in order to fulfill our mission in life.

#### WHO GIVES STRENGTH TO THE WEARY

I was so tired when I went to sleep last night - Thank You, Hashem, for returning my soul to me this morning with renewed strength and energy!

Thank You for also giving me the spiritual strength to overcome all the obstacles that I encounter every single day.

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#### WHO CROWNS ISRAEL WITH SPLENDOR

Thank You, Hashem, for giving us headcoverings (i.e. yarmulkes) that identify Jews as members of G-d's holy nation.

Thank you Hashem for providing me with opportunities to give you pride and glory through my fulfillment of mitzvos, as it says: "You are my servant, Yisrael; through you I am glorified." (Yeshaya 49:3)
